Dear Don Short:

District staff has inspected the above referenced location and has determined that an unsealed condition will present a pollution threat to water resources.

District staff has recommended that the Workover pit be lined with bentonite, constructed without slots, the bottom shall be flat and reasonably level and the free fluids must be removed. The fluids are to be removed from the Workover pit after drilling operations have ceased.

## NO completion fluids or non-exempt wastes shall be placed in the Workover pit.

The fluids should be taken to an authorized disposal well. Please call the District Office at (316) 337-7400 when the fluids have been removed. Please file form CDP-5 (August 2008), Exploration and Production Waste Transfer, through KOLAR within 30 days of fluid removal.
