I have tested with chloroform the following samples that have been submitted to me and have obtained the following results:

2060-2070	limestone, show of oil
2070-2110	limestone, show of oil
2110-2130	no sample
2130-2135	limestone, show of oil
2140-2145	limestone, show of oil
2145-2155	limestone, show of oil
2155-2162	limestone, show of oil
2162-2190	shale, no show of oil
2190-2200	limestone, trace of oil.

The samples listed above, from the Woods No. 1, sec. 21, T. 14 S., R. 15 E., Geage County, Kansas, show the presence of oil through the Mississippi lime from 2060-2162 and in a limestone band at 2190-2200 which is in the Kinderhook shale.
