The assessment for plugging all wells is one cent per foot, with a maximum of \$25.00 and a minimum of \$5.00.

STATE CORPORATION COMMISSION RULES AND REGULATIONS:

306. . . . "The owner or operator of a plugged well shall pay to the Commission on or before thirty days from the date of plugging, one cent per foot of well depth plugged: Provided, that the maximum charge shall be \$25 and the Minimum \$5; Provided, that this rule shall not apply to the plugging of holes as described in Rule 304"—(Seismic, Core and Other Exploratory Holes).

GENERAL STATUTES FOR 1935, 55-132. "Any person, owner or operator violating any of the provisions of this act shall, upon conviction thereof, be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and shall be fined in the sum of not more than \$500 or by imprisonment in the county jail of not more than six (6) months, or be subject to both fine and imprisonment."

If you are the holder of an interest bearing obligation of the decedent, the interest accrued only thru September 20, 1954, should be stated on your claim as a separate item. Any interest accruing after that date being an expense of the Estate.
