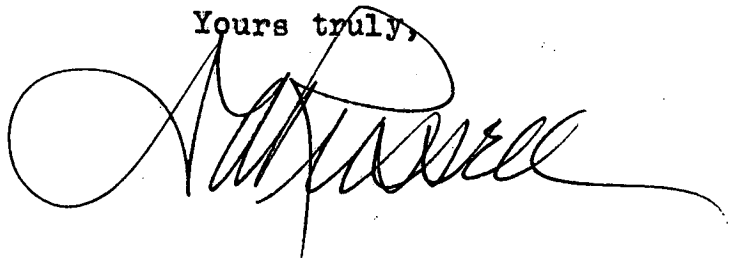

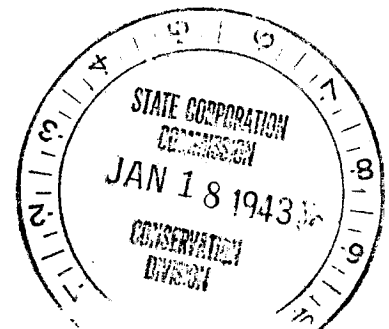

Re: Kaneb Oil Company, Dorr No. 1, South
Half Southwest Quarter 13-9-16, Rocks
County, Kansas.

On March 26, 1942, the above described well was shut down for the reason that Dakota water had eaten through the oil string in several places and the well was pumping water. We proceeded as soon as possible with the work of shutting off the Dakota with squeeze jobs. This work was completed and the well put back on the pump, June 5, 1942, and pumping continued from that date until July 16, 1942, twenty-four hours per day.

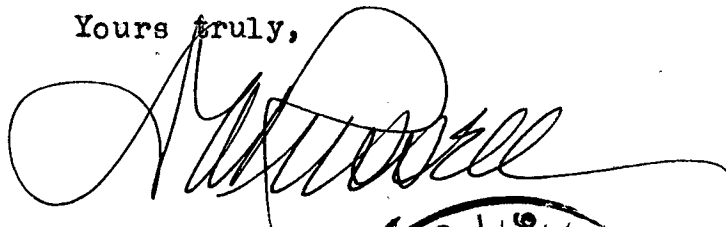
The cement job was successful in shutting out the water, but after pumping the well from June 5th to July 16th, no production was re-established, and the well was shut down.

The Kaneb Oil Company asks your permission to abandon and plug this well for the reason that no production whatever is available.
