Dear Mr. Norton:

This letter is to inform you that you have been granted an extension of time in which to close the drilling pits associated with the drilling of the Bender 2 well.

The original 365 days for closure expired October 11, 2008. This extension will expire December 11, 2008. We urge you to make every effort to close these pits within this time frame. In the event there is water standing in these pits, please dewater and dispose of fluids in an authorized disposal facility to expedite closure. Extension of this time frame automatically extends the time period for filing the Closure of Surface Pit form.

Failure to close the pit or request an additional extension prior to the expiration date may result in a fine in accordance with K.A.R. 82-3-602(c). An additional extension will only be granted for good cause and after K.C.C. field staff has made an inspection of the site. Should field staff discover that said pit has been closed before the date of extension request, an administrative penalty may be assessed to you through K.C.C. invoice.

The above referenced well was spudded on 10/11/2007. According to K.A.R. 82-3-602, "Drilling pits ... shall be closed within a maximum of 365 calendar days after the spud date of a well". The subject drilling pits must be closed by 10/10/2008. Ms. Flaharty:

The purpose of this letter is to request an extension to close our drilling pits on the above referenced well. We've made some progress over the summer in reaching this goal, within the 12 month time frame, but the weather in August and September made completing the task impossible. As I mentioned some of the pits are closed, but with 8+ inches of rain falling in August, followed by another 4 to 6 inches in September we just can't get the job done. What made the situation even worse was the extremely wet winter and spring we had in throughout our area as well; I actually documented some of these facts in a previous extension request. We check the location on a fairly regular basis, especially since we knew the deadline was fast approaching, but the weather just hasn't cooperated over the course of the past few months. We will continue to keep our eye on it and get it taken care of just as quickly as possible. Ray Dinkel, from the local District #4 office, here in Hays, mentioned to us about a month ago that he anticipated the Wichita office would be receiving near record numbers of pit extension requests, especially from certain, hard hit areas. If the local KCC officials are aware of it, then obviously it is indeed a problem.

In closing, I have attached a copy of your letter as requested, if you need any additional information please feel free to contact me. Thank you for your time and once again your patience regarding the pit closures.
