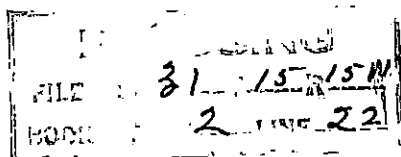

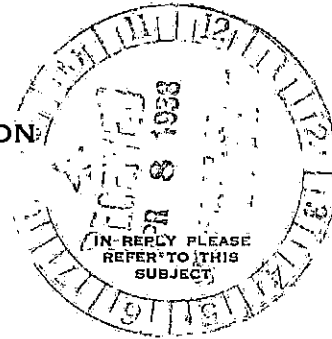

Dear Mr. Dahlgren:

Replying to attached letter from Doris Pearson and Innis Harris' reply, this well, according to Plugger's report, should not be giving any trouble. Mr. Alexander started plugging this well January 1, 1938, and held up his plugging report as the job was not completed March 1st, the date Mr. Sheil took his place.

Mr. Sheil visited the well March 24th and at that time the plugging job was completed. The hole was filled with mud from 3481 feet to 3000 feet, then bridged at 1025 feet with a fifteen-foot cement plug set on the bridge. Then the hole was filled with mud to the bottom of the cellar and capped at the top with cement.

I talked with Mr. Murfin's office this morning and Mr. Gardner thinks there is no foundation for Miss Pearson's complaint. He says at the time the well was drilled artesian flow of water was encountered and by permission of the landowner this water was ditched and allowed to flow across the land during the drilling of the well.

He says that the water well of which Miss Pearson complains was not good water at the time the well started drilling and that the men on the rig could not drink it and they obtained drinking water supply from another source. He says the complaint is no doubt based on an afterthought of Miss Pearson, who is somewhat disgruntled over the fact that they failed to get a commercial well, and because they did not acidize the small show of oil she feels that they have plugged a commercial well for some reason, and now hopes to fasten some blame onto the operator and make it appear that the water well is bad because of the artesian water from this plugged hole.

I will follow this letter with a report from Ed Sheil, or else make an investigation of the well myself, but from the information I have now I do not believe there is any foundation for the complaint of Miss Pearson.
