Dear Sir or Madam:

This letter is to inform you that you have been granted an extension of time in which to close the drilling pits associated with the Nattier 16-34-24 well.

The original 365 days for closure expired on 01/30/2016. This extension will expire on 5/01/2016. We urge you to make every effort to close these pits within this time frame. In the event there is water standing in these pits, please dewater and dispose of fluids in an authorized disposal facility to expedite closure. Extension of this time frame automatically extends the time period for filing the closure of surface pit form, **but not the time period for filing the waste transfer form (CDP-5).**

*Failure to close the pit or request an additional extension prior to the expiration date shall result in a monetary penalty in accordance with K.A.R. 82-3-602(a). An additional pit extension may be renewed upon request, but **no pit permit extension shall be extended beyond six months after the original deadline.***

Kathy,

SourceEP drilled a well in Jan 2015, attached is the NID.

Originally they were going to rework the well, but the company sold to K3. We have been trying to make arrangement to backfill the reserve pit around weather since Thanksgiving but earlier this week the rainwater that had accumulated in the pit was still frozen.

We want to get this pit closed as soon as the weather allows but will need a little more time. If we can get a 90 day extension like we discussed on the phone, then that will be plenty of time to close it correctly and keep the land owner happy.

I have met with Sid Nattier and he is aware of our attempt to pump dry and reclaim the pit.

Our intention is to close this pit as soon as possible but need a little more time.
